Hello Families,

This is a letter to keep you updated on things at St. Francis Rehab and Nursing Center. I am committed to keep you informed as things change here. Presently, we have no positive cases of Covid 19 in our center. I want to let you know that we have a new page added to our website that has a lot of information that will be helpful for you to review. Last Friday, May 22 we sent all of our specimens to the Public Health Lab for the COVID 19 testing. We received our results back yesterday and all of the results that came back with negative for COVID 19. We have two specimens that need to be redone because the specimen was not sufficient to do the test. We are waiting on the results of these two tests. Once this is done than we will have completed our baseline testing and then we can move into surveillance testing. The surveillance testing is supposed to occur every 7 to 10 days. This includes testing of all the employees and 10% of the residents each week. We are not sure at this point when they are going to start this testing.

Please note that when a resident leaves the facility for a doctor's appointment or an emergency room visit we are placing the resident in a 14 day quarantine room which is a private room on our Lodge wing. The purpose for this is to avoid any potential exposure to others. We are trying to be as cautious as possible because we know that COVID 19 can spread very easily.

I also want to remind you that we are prohibiting any non-essential items to come in to the residents as we know that the virus can live on objects for a short period of time and do not want to take the chance that it could be spread in this way. All laundry will be done by our laundry staff here. If there is an essential item that you would like to bring for your loved one it needs to be in a sealed container that we can disinfect and leave in our entry way for a period of time before bringing in the facility. We have made one change and are accepting floral deliveries. We will be cleaning and wiping down the vases.

We continue using cloth masks for our residents. The NH Public Health Department has requested that cloth masks be used on our residents while we are providing care for them and when they are out of their rooms. We have gotten many beautiful sewn masks delivered for use for our residents. We are very thankful for all of those who have donated these for us. As staff members we continue to wear disposable masks for all of our employees. The purpose of the masks is to have all of us keep our germs to ourselves. We are learning more about this virus and we know that it can be spread to others without showing any symptoms.

We continue to receive guidance from CMS, NH Public Health Department and Catholic Charities NH. I want to make sure that you know that we have received guidance to continue to be very strict in all the areas that we are doing such as social distancing, wearing masks and restricting visits. It is unlikely that these restrictions will be lifted for quite a period of time. This is due to the vulnerability of the people we serve in both the nursing center and the independent living.

While we know this is an incredibly challenging time for you and your family, please be assured that we remain committed to the care and support of your loved one here at St. Francis. Their safety, health and well-being remain our firm commitment.

We want to make sure that you are aware of the tablets that we have for you and your loved ones to connect to one another electronically. Please call and let us know if you would like to schedule a window visit for your resident as well.

All programs and services at St. Francis remain fully operational and your loved one continues to receive the highest level of care.
