This is a letter to keep you updated on things at St. Francis Rehab and Nursing Center. I am committed to keep you informed as things change here. Presently, we have no positive cases of Covid 19 in our center. I want to let you know that we have a page added to our website that has a lot of information that will be helpful for you to review. We have started our outdoor socially distant supervised visits with family members today. I know that I had written that we would be making phone calls to you to set up these visits but it would be very helpful if you called our main office and talk to Suzanne to make an appointment for this. Please call between 8 am and 4 pm Monday through Friday if possible. Visits are going very well and we are excited to be able to offer this to you.

We will also continue with the window visits and the virtual visits using google duo and face time. Please call Tasha at ext. to set up a visit per our usual routine.

Our next surveillance testing day is this Wednesday, June 24. We will be testing 10% of our residents and tenants and 100% of our employees. We will continue to do this testing every 7 to days. This is being done with the guidance of the NH Public Health Department.

We also want to remind you of our father's day parade on Sunday morning at 10:30 am. The starting location will be at Stafford Oil Company, located at 231 Court Street in Laconia; this is the same starting location that we used for the Mother's Day parade. Please be sure to be there at 10 am to ensure that there is plenty of time for the organization and lining up. We hope to have some vintage cars as a part of our parade. We want to make this a special time for all of our fathers, grandfathers and great-grand fathers. Please stay in your vehicle at all times and we encourage you to decorate your cars, honk your horns and to write messages to your loved ones on signs.

Please note that when a resident leaves the facility for a doctor's appointment or an emergency room visit we are placing the resident in a 14 day quarantine room which is a private room on our Lodge wing. The purpose for this is to avoid any potential exposure to others. We are trying to be as cautious as possible because we know that COVID 19 can spread very easily.

I also want to remind you that we are prohibiting any non-essential items to come in to the residents as we know that the virus can live on objects for a short period of time and do not want to take the chance that it could be spread in this way. All laundry will be done by our laundry staff here. If there is an essential item that you would like to bring for your loved one it needs to be in a sealed container that we can disinfect and leave in our entry way for a period of time before bringing in the facility. We are accepting floral deliveries. We will be cleaning and wiping down the vases.

We continue using cloth masks for our residents. The NH Public Health Department has requested that cloth masks be used on our residents while we are providing care for them and when they are out of their rooms. We have gotten many beautiful sewn masks delivered for use for our residents. We are very thankful for all of those who have donated these for us. As staff members we continue to wear disposable

masks for all of our employees. The purpose of the masks is to have all of us keep our germs to ourselves. We are learning more about this virus and we know that it can be spread to others without showing any symptoms.

While we know this is an incredibly challenging time for you and your family, please be assured that we remain committed to the care and support of your loved one here at St. Francis. Their safety, health and well-being remain our firm commitment.

We will continue to keep you updated as time goes on.
