
St. Francis Rehabilitation and Nursing Center Bishop Bradley Senior Living Community

Dear Residents, Tenants, Family Members and Employees,

I am writing to you to give you an update on things that are happening at St. Francis.

As you know, last Friday, we had one resident who tested positive for COVID-19 when she was sent to the local hospital. Although she tested negative after that, NH Public Health has asked us to treat her a positive for COVID-19. This resident had COVID-19 in the past and also is full vaccinated.

We went forward and followed guidelines from the NH Public Health Department who stated that we needed to test every resident, tenant and employee with a PCR test two times over the next 14 days. We did all this first round of testing between Monday and Wednesday and have obtained most of our test results. All of the tests came back negative. We have 5 employee samples that we are waiting on the results for. The negative test results are very good news for us.

We now need to do the testing again this coming week on Sunday and Monday. We need to wait for the test results to come back. The next set of test results should be back to us by a week from today, August 13.

The NH Public Health Department has stated that we need to continue to limit visitation until we get these next set of test results back. We will not have community dining or activities during this time while we are testing for the next 7 days or so. We have been directed that compassionate care visits need to be done in a limited way. They cannot be done as a routine. Some examples of why they can be offered are; to help a resident when they are first admitted to help them adjust to their new environment, to be with a resident who is terminally ill and close to the end of life, to console a resident who shows signs of depression or anxiety.

Please continue to call Mindy at ext. 330 to schedule your visits and keep in mind the guidelines that we have. You may also reach us to schedule window visits or electronic visits. Brandy can help with this at ext. 313.

We will be wearing N95 masks and face shields. These test samples will be sent out to the NH Public Health lab. Based on test results they will give us further guidance on how to proceed. We will keep you updated with any changes that happen.

Belknap County is in substantial transmission so we are encouraging everyone to wear masks when they are indoors in a public setting.

While we know this is an incredibly challenging time for you and your family, please be assured that we remain committed to the care and support of your loved one here at St. Francis. Their safety, health and well-being remain our firm commitment.

We will continue to keep you updated as time goes on.
